CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The Parbin-ata Louisa Briggs Award (**Award**) is being run by Glen Eira City Council (**Council**) in partnership with the Boon Wurrung Foundation.

1. By submitting a nomination you accept these conditions of entry.

2. Eligibility criteria

- (a) Subject to this section, a person is eligible to be nominated for the Award if they identify as female, and live or work in the City of Glen Eira.
- (b) Council employees may not be nominated and may not submit a nomination.
- 3. All nominations must include a completed nomination form and be submitted to: <u>MBickford@gleneira.vic.gov.au</u> by Friday 21 February 2020.
- 4. All nominations will be reviewed by the Award Panel consisting of a Council employee, a representative of the Glen Eira Reconciliation Action Plan Advisory Group and the Reconciliation Action Plan Working Group and a representative of the Boon Wurrung Foundation. The Award Panel reserves the right to disregard nominations which:
 - (a) are not correctly submitted in accordance with these conditions of entry; or
 - (b) the Award Panel deems, in its absolute discretion, to be offensive or discriminatory, or to be below community standards.
- 5. One nominee will be selected by the Award Panel to receive the Award. Selection will be made on the basis of the contribution made by the nominee, to reconciliation between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and the wider Australian community. The Award Panel's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 6. Council is not liable for late, lost, incomplete, invalid or incorrectly submitted nominations or illegible, corrupted or misdirected nominations, claims or correspondence due to error, tampering, theft, destruction, and communications failure or otherwise.

7. Privacy

If you are nominating another person for the award, you are responsible for ensuring that the person you have nominated has read and understood the following notice, and is comfortable with their personal information being used and disclosed as set out below.

The personal information requested in the nomination form is required to administer the Award, and will be shared with those directly responsible for reviewing submissions and managing the Award.
