Activity one

Watch the video Remembering Local People Pause and discuss the video as needed.

Discussion questions

- What is a memorial?
- What kinds of memorials could you see in the video?
- How do Traditional Owners remember people?
- Who would you like to remember forever?
- · Why should this person be remembered forever?
- If you were going to remember someone special, what would you do?
- Would you make something? What would your memorial look like? Where would you put your memorial?





Activity two

Think of someone you want to remember. Design a statue, plaque, memorial or other item here. Draw or make your design.

For example, you can make a mosaic portrait of your special person. You can use bits of coloured paper and glue them down to a page.

Present your memorial to the class. Sharing:

- The name of the person you are remembering
- Why is it important we remember them
- Why does the memorial reflect who they are?
